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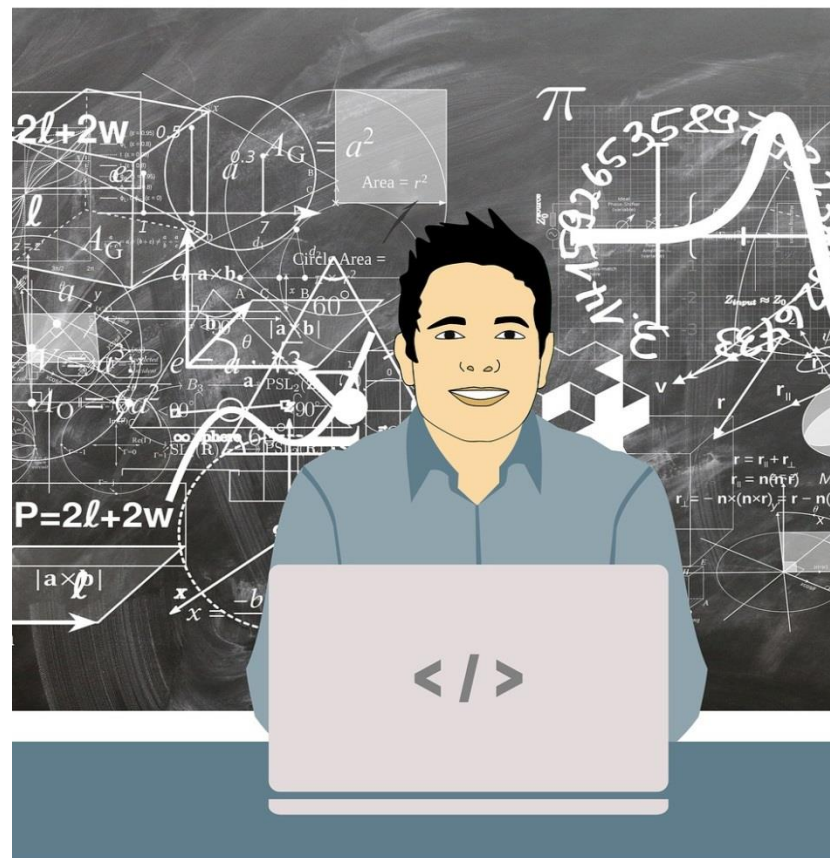
Digital Education Strategy of Hungary

 - tangible results regarding the **infrastructure**, the availability of devices, **digital teaching materials**, the **digital competences** of teachers/instructors, and school administration;
 - **all teachers** and instructors will **have an opportunity to (further) develop their digital competences**;

Vision of DES in Hungary

”[...] a high-quality and equitable public education system that prepares young people who are able to adapt to the European and global social and economic environment for successful participation in the labour market, in higher education, and in lifelong learning.”





Overall strategic goal in DES

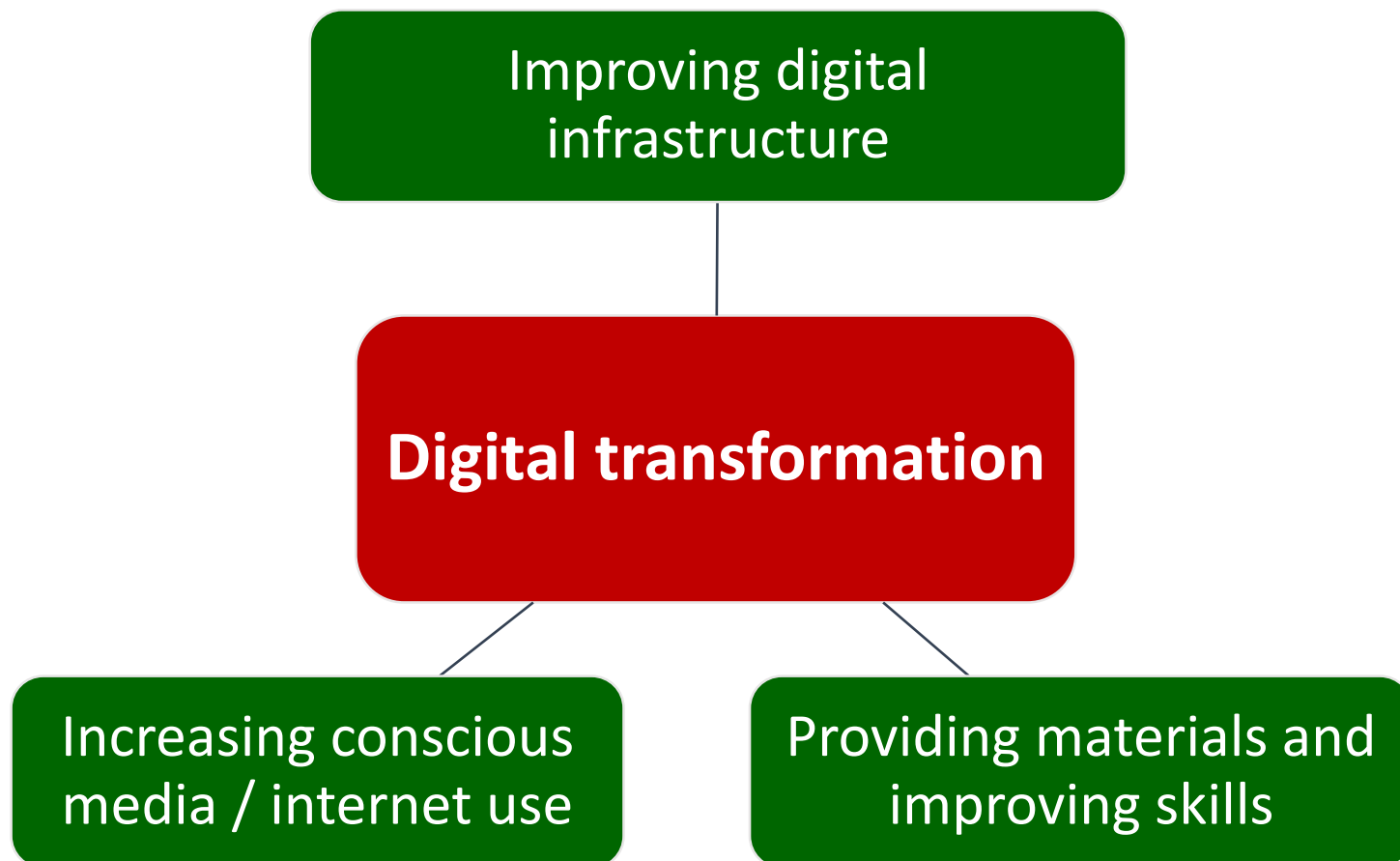
„to ensure that public education can provide **opportunities for acquiring the digital competences** required by society and the labour market with special regard to the requirements of vocational education and training, higher education and lifelong learning as well as to the aspects of effectiveness, equity, and efficiency”

Further development objectives (excerpt):

- the **ICT knowledge, methodological culture, motivation and use of educational staff** should meet the requirements of digital education



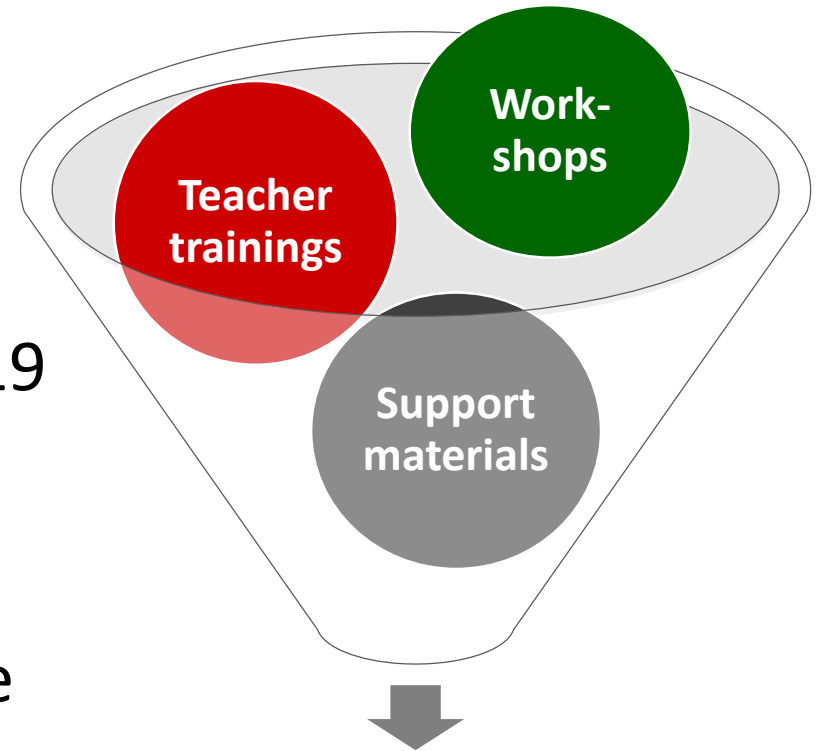
Digitalisation in education





Opportunities for teachers' learning

- Coordination: Klebelsberg Centre for Public Education Institution Management
- 40,000 teachers trained in 2019 using a 4x30 hours package
- Other, not centrally coordinated trainings available



Developing teachers' digital competences



Some numbers

- **~135 M EUR** co-funded by the Human Resources Development Operational Programme (EFOP-3.2.4-16-2016-00001)
- **40,593** teachers enrolled, 38,765 successfully trained in the first wave
- **4** trainings with **2** methods (online and blended trainings) developed
- **3** learning pathways designed





Training content

Level	Aims	Duration	Method
Novice	Acquiring basic knowledge of digital pedagogy and empowerment	30 hours in 3 weeks	e-learning
Basic	Developing skills in using digital tools, software and equipment, as well as developing (general) digital competences	30 hours in 4-8 weeks	blended
Intermediate	Developing pedagogical digital competences and using cloud-based solutions	30 hours in 8 weeks	e-learning
Advanced	Improving pedagogical digital competences	30 hours in 8 weeks	e-learning
